## What are UUCM'S office hours?

Our office hours are Monday thru Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM and Sundays from 9:30 to 11:30 AM.

## How do I schedule a meeting or reserve a space?

All requests must go through our Administrator Danielle Carlo at [admin@uumontclair.org](mailto:admin@uumontclair.org) or ext. 12. Please let us know the time, the purpose or group and anything needed for set-up.

## How do I schedule a meeting with a minister?

Once our new Senior Co-Ministers arrive in August, we will be sure to update you with their contact information and weekly office hours. If you need ministerial support in the meantime, please contact the office.

## Where can I park?

Although we do not have our own parking lot, there are several parking lots or decks within easy walking distance. Parking is also permitted at metered spots on the street and is free after 7:00 PM and on Sunday. The driveway at UUCM is reserved for employees during the week and on Sunday for those needing handicapped access ONLY.

## Can I get some photocopies made?

We will be more than happy to make copies for your UUCM-related committee, group or event. Since the staff is most familiar with our machines, we ask that you submit all requests to the office during regular office hours and we will be happy to assist you.

## Who do I talk to about my Annual Pledge?

## How do I make a monetary donation to UUCM?

Checks may be made out to **UUCM**. Please use the memo line to indicate to us your intentions (i.e., Annual Pledge, Plate Collection, MESH). You can also make donations via electronic funds transfer (EFT). Contact Emilia Sadonis for info.

## Can I make other kinds of donations to UUCM?

We do not accept donations of clothing, books or household items. We suggest donating used clothing to either the Salvation Army or the Red Cross. ## How do I submit a reimbursement request?

All reimbursement requests must come from the head of your committee or group and be received a week in advance of need. Submit your receipts to your committee leader and have them contact the Administrator to electronically fill out the request.

## How do I get an announcement into the order of service, Gazette or weekly email blast?

For Sunday announcements, all requests need to be sent to our office by Wednesday. We also send out our weekly email blast on Wednesday. All announcements from the previous Sunday are included in the blast. UUCM-related events take precedence over outside events but we do our best to accommodate all requests. ## How can I provide Sunday flowers for the Chancel?

## What are child dedications?

Child dedications are our ritual way of welcoming infants and children into the congregation. They are similar to Baptisms or Naming Ceremonies in other faith traditions, but as UU's, we believe that children are born pure with original blessing, not original sin. For members, a small child is dedicated as part of our Sunday morning worship services. We also perform Child Dedications in people's homes.

# What's Happening This Month

## Our Positive Place Covenant Group

Unitarian Mental Health Pioneer Dorothea Dix was an educator and social reformer whose devotion to the welfare of the mentally ill led to widespread international reform. She changed the lives of people singlehandedly, with mental illness living in hospitals from one of misery to one of care. In 1841, she was a congregant of William Ellery Channing in Boston, when he made a request of her, which changed the course of her life. She began teaching Sunday school at the East Cambridge Jail, a women's prison. She discovered the appalling treatment of the prisoners, particularly those with mental illnesses, whose living quarters had no heat. She immediately went to court and secured an order to provide heat for the prisoners, along with other improvements.

She began traveling around the state to research the conditions in prisons and poorhouses, and ultimately crafted a document that was presented to the Massachusetts legislature, which increased the budget to expand the State Mental Hospital at Worcester. But Dix wasn't content with reforms in Massachusetts. She toured the country documenting the conditions and treatment of patients, campaigning to establish humane asylums for the mentally ill and founding or adding additions to hospitals throughout the country – including the first psychiatric hospital in New Jersey. In the 1850's she toured Europe and was responsible for similar reforms in many countries there.

## You Can Reduce Your Use

### *News from our Green Sanctuary Committee*

As summer is here and the rhythm of our lives are changing again, I would like to bring a special book to your attention that might need a bit more space to be taken in and to enable us to 'see with new eyes': **Braiding Sweetgrass: Indigenous Wisdom, Scientific Knowledge, and the Teachings of Plants by Robin Wall Kimmerer** (ISBN978-1-57131-335-5). As a botanist, Robin Wall Kimmerer has been trained to ask questions of nature with the tools of science. As a Potawatomi woman, she embraces indigenous teachings that consider plants and animals to be our oldest guides. She brings these frameworks of understanding together in original ways, "taking us on a journey that is every bit as mythic as it is scientific, as sacred as it is historical, as clever as it is wise" (Elizabeth Gilbert). She circles toward a central argument: that the awakening of the wider ecological consciousness requires the acknowledgement and celebration of our reciprocal relationship with the rest of the living world. For only when we can hear the languages of other beings will we be capable of understanding the generosity of the earth, and learn again to give in return.
