# THANK YOU FROM OUR COMMITMENT 2 GIVE TEAM

The Commitment to Give (C2G) team would like to thank everyone who committed to supporting UUCM for the upcoming fiscal year beginning July 1. Our congregational budget for next year is approximately \$685,000, with over 70% of that raised during this campaign. Thanks to everyone's efforts, we are forecasting a final commitment number of \$495,000, which is a 6% increase from this year's expected pledge income. Also of note, 180 families have committed, with the average commitment being \$1,500, which is nearly the same as this current year.





Going forward one of our goals is to change the culture around Stewardship by making it a year round activity that will include fewer (but larger) fundraising activities, promoting financial education and shortening the duration of the formal C2G campaign. Additionally, in the coming months we have pledged to work with our staff to clean up our active membership roles in order to improve Realm functionality.

While raising sufficient funds to stop operating at a deficit remains challenging, we appreciate the increased engagement the congregation has shown this year. The focus was not just on high donors, but increased new donors, which we achieved by meeting with over 20 groups. These meetings had an ancillary benefit of being able to hear our ideas and address your concerns. As a lay-led Congregation, we can only thrive by member participation and funding-so thank you again for your great support with your time, your talents, and your trea\$ure!

# LEADER'S SUMMIT AFFIRMS CONGREGATIONAL FOCUS ON EIGHTH PRINCIPLE AND INTERSECTIONAL ANTI-OPPRESSION

As Rae Dumont explained in her report at the May 18th Leadership Summit - "the Strategic Plan was approved in 2020, the 8th Principle was affirmed in 2021. Somewhere in there we had a pandemic." It is obvious that our congregation is moving through the turbulent waters of necessary change, brought on by global events. The Leadership Summit also proved that we are committed to necessary change, required by our conviction that anti-racism and anti-oppression are core expressions of our Unitarian Universalist faith.

On Thursday May 18th, leaders from our congregation's various ministries gathered together to break down silos, build relationships, and converse with our Governance teams - the Board, Council on Ministry, and Nominating and Leadership Development Committee.

The Leadership Summit is an annual event that creates space for fellowship through breaking bread and shared conversation and converse with our Governance Teams who present on their priority programs. Each governance presentation affirmed a commitment and announced ongoing work toward our 8th principle aims. Nicole Gray coordinator of the Council on Ministries shared how the council liaisons were working with ministry teams and aiding them in their commitment to our Mission and our 8th Principle affirmation. She also offered that speaking about the "8th Principle" is how we speak about our commitment to anti-racism and anti-oppression.

Shannon Gattens, president of the Board of Trustees, noted that the Board chose 8th Principle integration as one of its annual priorities and to this end, encouraged our many teams to add 8th Principle language to their charge statements. Shannon also uplifted the Out Front charge as a model which includes this statement of purpose: "Educate and advocate within the congregation and within the community on issues surrounding gender and sexuality diversity with an intersectional lens that de-centers whiteness and counters oppressions such as cis-normativity, heteronormativity, classism and ableism." Upon hearing this, Summit participants erupted into boisterous praise.

Matt Silverman and Dan Silver then spoke about their Nominating and Leadership Development work as a mechanism for empowering new leaders and serving the ultimate end of inclusion. Redeveloping the Harvest the Power program, making it more accessible and more directly related to the interworking of our congregational life will ensure that any potential leaders, with interest and capacity, have what they need to succeed in congregational leadership.

It is obvious that our congregation's commitment to the 8th principle remains and is evolving and being integrated, not only as an idea but as a practice. The work is in its infancy, and will require more attention, and as Nicole Gray shared, "the embrace of all our members." Yet even as we strive, we can celebrate many necessary strides forward.


